1 Concerning Submissions of Abstracts (Poster Sessions Only) and Proposals for Information Exchange

We are accepting a broad range of poster session abstracts and Information exchange proposals on the theme of caring and peace.

1) Submission period: Friday, October 1, 2010 to Friday, December 24, 2010

2) All abstracts, etc. must be submitted online to the Conference website at <https://apollon.nta.co.jp/ihccp2011/>.

Only poster session abstracts will be accepted. Presenters will be allotted a specific time period to be at the poster session venue and poster presentations and discussions should be conducted within that time period.

Information Exchange: 60 min. have been allotted. We will provide a meeting room, PC and projector. Information Exchange will be chosen by lot if the number of proposals exceeds available space. All sessions should be conducted in English. If you are conducting the session in Japanese, please provide an interpreter.

Guidelines for Submission of Abstracts:

• For Poster Presentations and Information Exchange, applicants must submit an abstract of between 300 to 400 words containing the following information:

*Poster presentation (reports on actual nursing practices): background, content of nursing practices, ethical considerations, results, observations and 3 keywords

*Poster presentation (research studies): purpose, method, ethical considerations, results, observations and 3 keywords

*Information Exchange: Purpose, explanation of how the gathering will be conducted, program content

* Applicants will be informed of the results around the beginning of March 2011.

* Those whose applications are accepted must register before April 30, 2011.

2 Registration

1) Early registration and pre-registration should be done online. Online registration commences at the beginning of July 2010. Please see the Conference website for details.

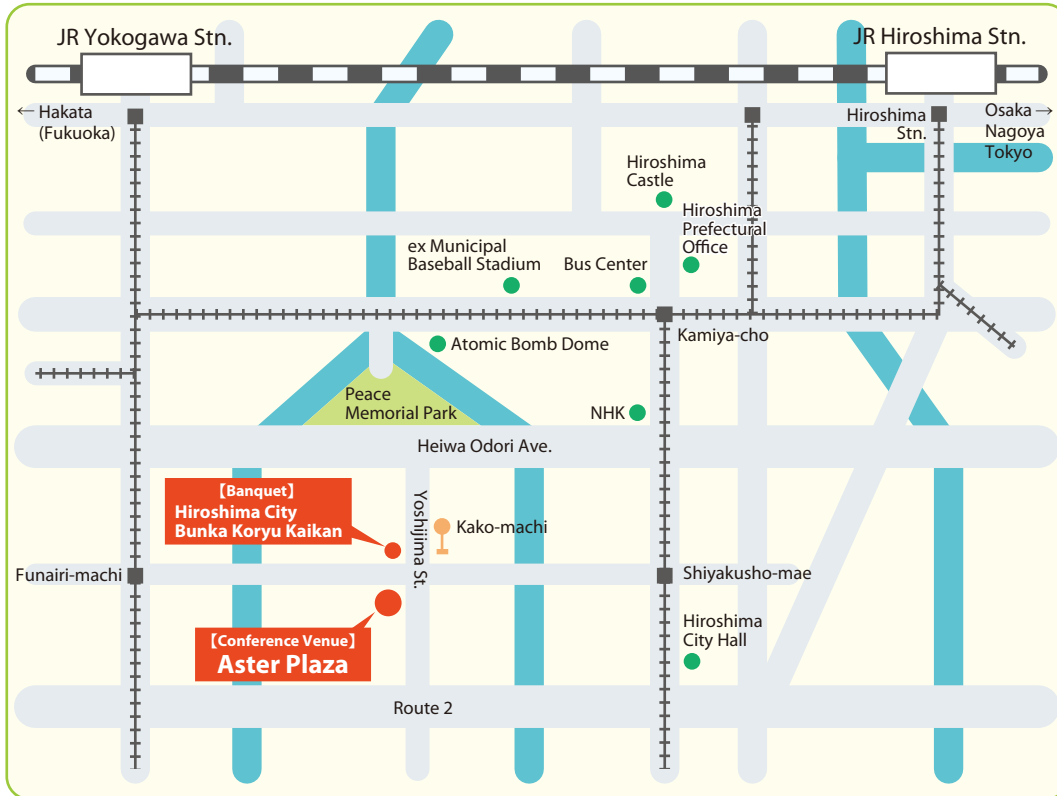

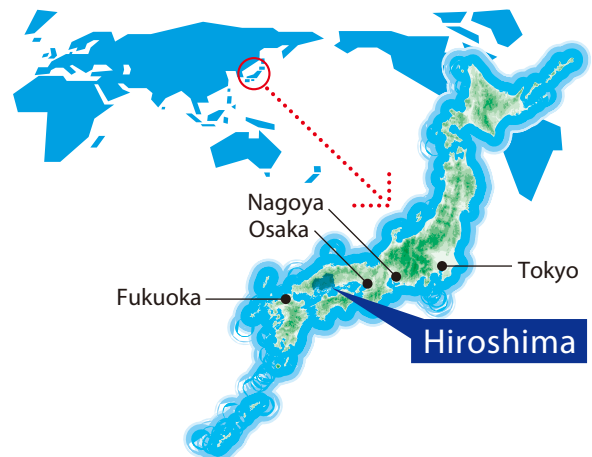
