


Nursing: The Philosophy and Science of Caring — Jean Watson



This book is a comprehensive overview of earlier Watson books and is the most comprehensive of Watson's Human Caring Theory; the history and evolution of Caring Science philosophy and theory.

Jean's first publication was originally published in 1979, Boston, Little Brown. This version was reprinted by University Press of Colorado celebrating the 40th anniversary of Watson's Caring Science. This first edition is more valued in that it is an historical, first of its kind. It lacks the currency of ideas, although the core framework is already there. It is considered a collectors book.





Postmodern Nursing and Beyond — Jean Watson



This book addresses 'beyond theory' toward a shared ontological relational paradigm for human caring and healing. It reframes and integrates caring healing modalities and relates Nightingale's own writing of nursing to practices of caring-healing modalities.

It takes a feminist turn toward a relational ontological world view with Nursing as ancient Archetype for Healing; Nursing as Artistry of Practice; and Nursing as Architect for ontological designs for healthcare system design.

This is a futuristic book that addresses Watson's Caring Science as a larger paradigm of a worldview shift into an energetic cosmology of Healing and Health.



Unitary Caring Science - The Philosophy and Praxis of Nursing — Jean Watson



This book develops the foundation of scientific disciplinary principles such as axiology, ethics, ontology, epistemology, methodology, and praxis in the context of evolving worldview cosmology of One of Belonging to Infinity – quantum universe.

It traces core nursing literature, which excludes 'caring' in the metaparadigm, to a convergence of discourse to Caring being included to the latest turn toward 'Unitary Caring Science' as a maturing of the discipline, addressing nursing's phenomena of wholeness, caring consciousness, energy, relational ontology and evolution of human consciousness.

Another classic Watson book for students interested in the evolution of the discipline and location of caring in the meta-paradigm, this work traces the discourse of the meta-paradigm.

This book shows Jean's evolution of thinking from the 2008 book *Nursing: the Philosophy and Science of Caring.* Required reading for Watson Scholars.

The book discusses at length eight different Caring Factor surveys, primary research tools for those using the Caritas Processes®, which identify constructs that either support or impede caring in multiple settings. The first section focuses on the theoretical underpinnings of Caritas and presents seven adaptations of the Caring Factor Survey. Section 2 addresses measurements and methods for facilitating a caring relationship between nurse and patient. Measurements and interventions to facilitate Caritas in a variety of settings are the focus of Section 3, and the final sections address the international measurement and international comparisons of Caritas. The volume will be an important resource for nurse leaders, educators, administrators in academia including unit managers, and for hospitals with or seeking Magnet status. The book serves as a complement to Watson's Assessing and Measuring Caring in Nursing and Health Sciences and Creating a Caring Science Curriculum: A Relational Emancipatory Pedagogy for Nursing.
