

Round Table: Caring for the Profession: The Progress of the Profession of **Nursing in the Present and Future**

Utilizing the Caritas Processes, Mr. Brandman will reveal how he championed the development of advanced nursing practice over 25 years in the state of Hawai'i. He will show how the use of Caritas supported the growth of social capital in his home state, leading to political capital and the establishment of full practice authority in statute for advance practice nurses. The process continues today, in committees with APRN colleagues, reviewing and revising rules promulgated by the Hawaii Board of Nursing and various agencies which are not consistant with the curent law.

Caring for the nursing profession through collaboration: The purpose of my discussion is to emphasize the importance of collaboration to move the nursing profession forward. We can open doors, spark innovation, and affect change by surrendering ego and being open minded. We gain trust. We gain a voice.

Working in mental health nursing for a long time has led me to often ask myself, what our profession of nursing consists of? Observation from a psychological point of view is much more than a passive activity. Just think of when we learn a new activity under the gaze of a competent tutor ... what if he was also loving? We're not used to thinking that loving-kindness can affect learning or the process of care but if you think about it, being authentically present is fundamental to our practice, as well as the ability to adapt to the patient's needs and language.

Dr. Ardis, Medical Director of the SanLuca Hospital, Lucca, Italy and professor at the University of Pisa Medical School. His focus is on the humanization of care. He says "Medical Doctors need to stop and listen to the patient." (He is an advocate for Advance Practice of Nursing in Italy.)
