Dr. Jean Watson, Ph.D., RN, AHN-BC, FAAN, LL (AAN) is a Distinguished Professor Emerita and Dean Emerita of the University of Colorado Denver, College of Nursing, where she held the Endowed Chair in Caring Science at the University of Colorado, Denver and Health Sciences Center. She is the founder of the original Center for Human Caring in Colorado and an American Academy of Nursing Fellow. Watson also is the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the National Fetzer Institute Norman Cousins Award, an International Kellogg Fellowship in Australia, a Fulbright Research and Lecture Award in Sweden, and six internationals. She held the nation's first endowed chair in Caring Science for 16-years; holds fifteen (15) Honorary Doctoral Degrees, including twelve (12) International Honorary Doctorates. Her work is studied and implemented worldwide. She is a widely published author and recipient of many awards and honors in the Science of Human Caring[™], including the classic: <u>Nursing: The Philosophy and Science of Caring</u>, which identifies the 10 core <u>Caritas Processes</u>, universals of human caring, necessary for studying and implementing a model of Caring Science in practice. This work restores the deep-spiritual dimensions of Love with caring-healing as the foundation for preparing a new level of practitioners in Caring Science/Caring Healthcare. In October 2013, Dr. Watson was inducted as a Living Legend by the American Academy of Nursing, its highest honor.
