The organization has also made a significant investment in care for the caregiver. Dedicated Wellness Rooms throughout **CAVHS** provide restorative spaces for staff to pause, reflect, and recharge. These environments are designed with calming imagery, mindfulness tools, and healing aesthetics to offer emotional and spiritual renewal during demanding workdays.

Further strengthening staff well-being, **CAVHS** has implemented Healing Circles, creating safe and supportive spaces for reflection, storytelling, and connection. Offered both in person and virtually, these circles foster resilience, empathy, and a sense of shared humanity—helping staff feel supported, seen, and less alone in their work.
